Country Creation AUTION ITEMS “NEW TO RULES” – All entries into the Country Creation auction division, we are adding a **Craftsmanship Interview**. This will give the exhibitor a chance to talk to a judge about their item(s). This will be a 5 min. interview only, allowing time for the other exhibitor to interview. This interview can be read aloud from their story of how the exhibitor created the item.

Fifteen items will be allowed to sell in the Junior Auction on Saturday, October 3rd, 2020 from the Country and Culinary Creations for Auction Division. In the Country Creations Division, a Grand Champion, Reserve Champion and third place will be selected in the following youth categories: Junior, Intermediate and Senior. In the Culinary Creations Division, a Grand and Reserve Champion will be selected in the following youth categories: Junior, Intermediate and Senior.

Nine items will be sold from the Country Creations Division and **six** items will be sold in the Culinary Creations Divisions in the Junior Youth Auction. (Rule 5. Continued following page)

Any exhibitor with a champion in this division will be allowed to sell their Country or Culinary Creations Exhibit and an eligible livestock exhibit. **At Tag-In an exhibitor will only be able to enter in either Country or Culinary Division if they have an animal project.**

INFORMATIONAL MEETING: Thursday, September 10th, 2020 6:30 PM – 7:30 PM (highly recommended to ATTEND)

TAG – IN Saturday, September 19th, 2020 from 11:00 AM – 2:00 PM for all Country Creation Divisions & Culinary Divisions auction items only.

If you are entering in the OPEN DIVISION only, you do not need to be at Tag-In.

Do Not Bring Auction Item(s) to Tag-In only W-9 form will be required, please bring Social, for Country Creation Divisions (dimensions & size of project(s) needed) & Culinary Divisions

The dimensions of the **Country Creations Division** project will be required for approval to go through the show ring by the CLB Committee.

Culinary Creations – additional 6 slots in the auction. All entries must tag-in on the September 19th. Check in for culinary entries is still Monday, September 28th, 2020.

Handwritten Thank You Notes are required on Sunday, October 4th, 2020 before the project will be allowed to leave the building.

Photography – All photos must be delivered on a jump drive with correct information during Tag-In on Saturday, September 19th. **Please read the rules for photo entries.**

Notice: All Exhibitors are cautioned to read carefully the following rules, as the Creative Living Committee will enforce them.

1. There are two Divisions in the Creative Living Building.
 - a. Open Division: This division is open to anyone age 3 and up who resides in Waller County or attend one of the three schools in the county. Ribbons will be awarded, and points will be earned for all items entered in any of the 12 categories in the division. (See specific rules for more information).
 - b. Country and Culinary Creations for Auction Division: This division is only open to boys and girls eligible to compete under 4H, FFA, or FCCLA (FHA) for one of the 15 lots in the Jr. Livestock Auction and is subject to all the rules & regulations of the WCFA. (See specific rules on page 3 for more information).
2. All entries shall be labeled with the appropriate tag before being received by the division Chairperson.
3. All perishable items will be donated to the judge's luncheon and/or Country Store.
4. All entries can be entered once.
5. Items in all divisions shall be picked up on Sunday, October 4th, 2020 between **8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.** The Waller County Fair Association and the Creative Living Committee will not be responsible for items not picked up on Sunday, October 4th, 2020. Items not picked up will become the property of the Creative Living Department and the Waller County Fair Association.
6. Exhibitors entering in the Open Division only, may enter four (4) items in each class so long as there are no duplicates. **The Exhibitor must be the person who made the item.** All entries must be clean, neat and in excellent condition, or it will not be accepted for exhibition.
7. **Exhibitors entering in the Auction Division, may enter two (2) items in each the Country Division and/or Culinary Division unless you have an animal.** There will be no duplicates allowed in either divisions. **The Exhibitor must be the person who made the item.** All entries must be clean, neat and in excellent condition, or it will not be accepted for exhibition.
8. Business cards or names will not be attached to any item exhibited.
9. Decisions of the judges are final. Any person attempting to interfere with or influence the judge's decision or attract the judge's attention to his or her exhibit, shall be excluded from competition.
10. **"NEW" – All Country Creation Division ONLY.** All exhibitor will be in a **Craftmanship Interview**, allowing the exhibitor to talk to a judge about their project. This interview can be read aloud from their story of how the exhibitor created the item.
11. **All auction items entered in Country Creation and Culinary MUST have a story page attached to their item(s). This is your voice to the judge during judging time. The story card can be picked up at Tag-in and must be turned in at check-in.**
12. Every effort will be made for the security of the exhibition, but the Waller County Fair Association will not be responsible for any items broken, lost or stolen while on the Fairgrounds.

13. Categories in the Creative Living Building will be the Golden Age, Open Adult and Youth. (See page 2 for specific rules).
14. All Exhibitors entering the **Open Division only**, must pay a \$5.00 entry fee. (No matter how many divisions entered). Country Creations and Culinary Creations for Auction will also have project entry fees. (See page 3 for specific rules).

Judging and Awards

1. Each entry will be judged according to its own quality and receive a ribbon.
2. Grand and Reserve Champion rosettes will be awarded for the best items in each division for each age category.
3. High Point Awards will be given to Exhibitors in the categories of Golden Age, Open Adult and Youth who receive the most total points.

Points are as follows:

Grand Champion	100	Points
Reserve Champion	75	Points
Honorable Mention & Best of Class	50	Points
Blue Ribbon	25	Points

4. High Point winners in Golden Age, Open Adult and Youth will be posted in the building on Monday, September 28th. High Point Awards may be picked up on Sunday, October 4, 2020 between **8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.** All results are final once distribution of awards begins.
5. **High Point award presentation Friday, October 2, 2020 at 11:00am.**

Creative Living Categories

Golden Age: Competition in this category is limited to residents who vote or pay taxes in Waller County and are 62 years of age or older as of fair time.

Open Adult: Competition in this category is open to residents who vote or pay taxes in Waller County and are ages 19 through 61. Exhibitors need not belong to a club or to an organization to enter this category.

Youth: Exhibitors in this category must reside in and/or attend school in either Royal, Waller or Hempstead ISD boundaries. This category will be divided into five (5) categories for judging.

Tag-In Will Be September 19, 2020 from 11:00 AM – 2:00 PM

1. All Country and Culinary Creations for Auction Exhibitors are subject to the General Rules and Regulations of the Waller County Fair Association. The Creative Living Building Committee and the Waller County Fair Association reserves rights to its executive committee the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle all matters, questions and differences thereto.
2. Entries are limited to boys and girls who are current members of Waller County 4-H Clubs, FFA and FCCLA (FHA) Chapters and Junior FFA Members who reside in and/or attend a school in either Royal, Waller or Hempstead ISD boundaries.
3. The following must be met in order to compete in the Country and Culinary Creations for Auction Division:
 - A. Eligibility Form, W-9, Exhibitors Information Card and tags must be presented at tag-in, September 15th.
 - B. See General Rules #15**
 - C. Must also comply with Parent Work Rule (Please refer to WCFA general rules).
4. The description card must be filled out by the exhibitor explaining the details of how your project was assembled and submitted to the committee at the same time as the project. This is your chance to talk to the judges so be as descriptive as you can, pictures of progress are not required but encouraged.
5. **Fifteen** items will be allowed to sell in the Junior Auction on Saturday, October 3rd, 2020 from the Country and Culinary Creations for Auction Division. In the Country Creations Division, a Grand Champion, Reserve Champion and third place will be selected in the following youth categories: Junior, Intermediate and Senior. In the Culinary Creations Division, a Grand and Reserve Champion will be selected in the following youth categories: Junior, Intermediate and Senior. **Nine** items will be sold from the Country Creations Division and **six** items will be sold in the Culinary Creations Divisions in the Junior Youth Auction. (Rule 5. Continued following page)
Any exhibitor with a champion in this division will be allowed to sell their Country or Culinary Creations Exhibit and an eligible livestock exhibit. **At Tag-In an exhibitor will only be able to enter in either Country or Culinary Division if they have an animal project.**

If the exhibitor places third in Country Creations Division, they will have to choose whether to sell their eligible livestock exhibit or Country Creation Exhibit.
6. All exhibitors will comply with the General Rules of the Waller County Junior Livestock Auction.
7. Baked Goods and Favorite Recipe items must be accompanied by **1 copy** of the recipe for judging and display purposes. Baked Goods, Favorite Recipe and/or Decorated Confections selected for Auction must be re-baked and/or decorated for the buyer. Project must be delivered by the exhibitor on the date requested by buyer.
8. Thank You Notes for the junior auction - Exhibitors **must** turn in a handwritten "Thank-You" Letter(s) to the buyer and Sponsors in an unsealed pre-addressed stamped envelope(s) to committee member at the front table. This rule must be met

before project will be released on **Sunday October 4th**. Failure to comply with this rule will result in a fine as determined by the Waller County Fair Association.

9. All Country Creations exhibits must be able to fit through the doors of Creative Living Building which is 4x5x6' any combination and the gate to the Auction Arena Area which is 4x5x6' any combination and **must be fully assembled. Exhibit must also be transportable by the exhibitor and one other person.**

10. The Creative Living Building Committee will allow Hardship items in the **Culinary Creations Division** for auction if an animal project dies between tag-in on September 19th and check in on September 28th. This does not include the Country Creation Division.

The Creative Living Building Committee Chairman must be notified of the death of the animal for the Culinary Creations Division item to be entered for auction.

The participation of the exhibitor and animal will be confirmed with the Creative Living Building Committee and the Waller County Fair Executive Committee that the animal fell under.

All the guidelines for the Junior Livestock Auction will be adhered to, same as the other entries in the Culinary Creations Division.

*All Culinary Auction winners must remake their item prior to the day of the auction. * EXCLUDING decorated confections at the discretion of the committee members.

1. All baked entries must be accompanied with the recipe for judging and display purposes.
2. Open Division - All cookies, candies, rolls, biscuits, doughnuts, etc. must consist of three (3) on a paper plate, covered with plastic wrap or sealed in a Ziploc bag. A fourth item is to be wrapped separately and attached to the top of the entry for tasting by the judges.
3. All other food entries, such as cakes, pies and breads must be on a firm base such as foil covered cardboard, aluminum pie pan, paper plate, etc., and must be covered with clear plastic wrap. One piece is to be cut by the judges to taste.
4. All baked goods will be donated to judge's luncheon.

1. Decorated cakes will not be cut nor require a recipe, since they will be judged on appearance only.
2. Decorated cookies must consist of three (3) on a paper plate, covered with plastic wrap.

- Any non-edible decoration used must be easily removed as if the confection was going to be eaten. Any edible decoration will be given more consideration by the judges than a non-edible decoration.

- All entries in the canned goods division must be in standard canning jars. A standard jar is one made especially for canning and has the brand name embossed on the side. Examples: Kerr, Ball, Anchor-Hocking, etc. No mayonnaise, jelly or similar jars will be accepted.
- The lids and rims must be standard and free of rust. Any jar not sealed will be disqualified. Rings and Rims must be left on the jars.
- All entries must be clean and labeled as to the contents and date it was canned.
- Canned goods will not be opened. They will be judged by appearance only. If you want them judged for taste, enter the item in Favorite Recipe.
- Jars must be filled up to the neck and no decorations on jars.

5. All entries must be of good quality and hold up well during the Fair. (In case of deterioration, items must be picked up by the exhibitor or it will be destroyed.)
6. Each entry will be judged on its own merit.

Digital Entries for Photography-New Guidelines

1. All photographs must have been taken by the exhibitor.
2. All photographs must be submitted a jump drive to CLB Committee member responsible for Photography check-in on Saturday, September 19th (Directions below).
3. No professional portraits will be accepted.
4. Inappropriate subject matter will be disqualified at the Chairperson's discretion.
5. \$5.00 entry fee and participant information cards must be submitted by September 19, 2020 to the Creative Living Building on tag-in day.
6. Only 4 photographs will be allowed for each class. Any more than 4 will be deleted from judging.
7. All jump drives should be picked up on Sunday Oct. 4th by 8 am to 9am. Any left after this time, CLB committee will not be responsible.

Submitting your digital photos:

1. Name each photo as follows before saving to jump drive. Description card must be filled out and must match file name of each photo or it will not be judged.
 1. Exhibitors name
 2. Age division (Preschool, Peewee, Junior, Intermediate, Senior, Open Adult, and Golden Age)

COUNTRY STORE

You must have an exhibitor's number showing that you have entered competition in the Creative Living Building of the Waller County Fair. We encourage all age exhibitors to place items in the County Store.

1. Any non-profit organization may sell items in the Country Store if at least one person from their organization is an exhibitor in the Creative Living Building. The organization will receive a percentage for their organization.
2. Nonperishable sale items may be entered beginning Sunday, September 27th, 2020, from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Items will be accepted daily (when building is open) thereafter to replenish stock as needed.
3. Baked goods for sale will be accepted beginning Monday, September 28th from 7:30am to 9am, and through Saturday, October 3, 2020 during hours the building is open.
4. Items for sale must be the same as those listed in the Creative Living Building divisions. Canned products must have been prepared within the last year only. No used or damaged articles will be accepted. The Chairperson has the option to refuse unacceptable articles.
5. Items entered for sale will not be judged and will not receive a ribbon.
6. Due to limited space, only the exhibitor may bring in a reasonable number of like items for sale. Items may be replaced as sold. If possible, like items should be placed in containers for display in the Country Store.
7. Sale items must have a Country Store sale tag attached with the following information:
 - A. Exhibitor's name and number
 - B. Sale Price
 - C. Item Description
8. All food items sold in the Country Store must be accompanied by a recipe or list of ingredients.
9. Exhibitors who work in the Country Store will receive 85% of the monies made from the sale of his/her items sold whereas non-workers will receive 65% of the monies made from the sale of his/her items sold. Non-Profit Organizations will receive 75% of the monies made from the sale of their items. The additional 15% to 35% will go to the Waller County Fair Association.
10. Items not sold must be picked up on Sunday, October 4, 2019, between **8:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.**
11. Monies for the sale items will be paid at the time of pick-up.
12. Although all precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of all items in the County Store, neither the Waller County Fair Association nor the Chairperson(s) will be responsible for lost, stolen, damaged or broken items.
