Rules and Regulations

1. All Breeding Doe Goat exhibitors are subject to the General rules and regulations of the WCFA. The WCFA reserves to its executive committee the final and absolute right to interpret all rules, regulations, and arbitrarily settle all matters, questions and differences thereto.
2. **ELIGIBILITY:** *See all WCFA General Rules.* Eligibility Form will be required by each exhibitor to be submitted at check-in time at show date. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Substitutions for scholastic ineligibility will be allowed with the approval of the committee chairman. Substitute exhibitor must also submit a WCFA eligibility form. **All exhibitors are also REQUIRED to fill out a W9 form in its entirety.**
3. The parent work rule will be enforced according to the WCFA General Rules (*see WCFA general rules*). Please read carefully and understand your obligations under this rule. Parents must be signed up to work prior to **Tuesday, September 27, 2022 (fair check-in)** or the exhibitor will not be allowed to check in. Sign-ups (via WCFA website) open **September 1st at midnight.**
4. There will be an **Exhibitor Meeting on April 26, 2022 at 7:00 PM.** The exhibitor and one legal guardian are encouraged to attend in order to get more information on showing a breeding doe in the WCF. Everyone is responsible for reading and adhering to the Breeding Doe and Waller County Fair General Rules.
5. **The Breeding Doe Committee will tag-in on June 16, 2021 at the Waller County Fairgrounds from 6:30 to 7:30 PM. ALL DOES MUST HAVE A SCRAPIES TAG AT TAG-IN!** Exhibitors must be present at tag-in and a mandatory front and side view picture will be taken of each entry with the exhibitor. Please have exhibitor entry form and W9 form completed and have check or exact change available for tag-in fees.
6. All goats are **REQUIRED** to weigh at least 30lbs at tag-in in June. A doe may be any breed or crossbreed. An Exhibitor may tag in as many does as they like, however only two may be shown at the Waller County Breeding Doe Show. All does will be shown in order by weight and broken into at least three classes, provided there at least five does to a class at the Waller County Fair Doe Show.
7. All does must have tipped horns (no sharp points) or be de-horned.

8. Does may NOT be bred or have kidded in the past. **ALL DOES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A HEALTH CERTIFICATE AND PROOF THAT THE DOES ARE NOT BRED. THIS MUST PERFORMED BY A LICENSED VETERINARIAN within 30 days of show day (on or after August 28, 2022). Health certificate and copy of blood work showing negative pregnancy OR a statement that states the doe has been palpated by a licensed veterinarian and is open and not bred must be submitted at fair check-in in order to show.**

9. All does must have a scrapies tag placed in the ear by tag-in.

10. Does may not have two-year-old teeth at tag-in, or three-year-old teeth by show. Teeth will be checked at both events and disqualification may occur if said teeth are present.

11. There will be no bracing or driving of does during the show. All does will be shorn to the qualifications of show does. Contact a Breeding Doe Committee member with questions regarding show grooming.

12. All does previously sold at any junior livestock auction will be ineligible to tag-in for the WCFA Breeding Doe show. Also, all does sold at the WCFA livestock show will be tattooed upon exit of the sale ring with a small "W" in the web of the tail to ensure that this animal cannot be tagged-in for future WCFA shows.

13. Each exhibitor may tag in his/her goats in the family name. However, they must be designated to one child at the progress show and may not be changed once recorded at progress show.

14. Entry Fee: *see WCFA General Rules*

14 . Waller County Fair ear tags will be used at tag-in. If the tag comes out of a goat's ear, the Committee Chairman should be notified immediately (preferably within 48 hours before any healing can begin) so that the goat can be re-tagged. Failure to do so will result in the disqualification of the animal. The arrangements for the retagging are the responsibility of the exhibitor.

15. The Progress Show will be held Saturday, August 14, 2021 at 8:00 AM at the Waller County Fairgrounds. First year exhibitors are required to participate. However, it is recommended that the doe entries still be present for progress show and weigh-in.

16. For the Progress Show, it is recommended that the does must be show clipped and the exhibitors are to be neatly dressed (walking shorts acceptable). *If does were tagged-in under a*

family name they must be designated to the exhibitor at this time. Showmanship classes will be divided into the following groups based upon the exhibitor's age on September 1, 2019:

- A. Senior - Ages 14-18
- B. Junior - Ages 9-13
- C. Novice - First year exhibitors

The same showmanship classes will apply for the Showmanship Show at the WCF as long as there are enough exhibitors to allow a minimum of 3 exhibitors per class.

17. Fair Check-in: ALL does must be checked-in and weighed on Tuesday, September 27, 2021 between 9:00 and 10:00 AM at the Waller County Fairgrounds (**NO EXCEPTIONS**). Only does entered and being shown are allowed in the fairgrounds. **All doe entries must have a clear/current health certificate (valid within 30 days of the show) which states the doe has been palpated by a licensed veterinarian and is open and not bred and/or a copy of blood work stating they are not bred (showing negative).** If an exhibitor cannot bring his/her animals due to school activities, parents/guardians may check-in entries. Pen numbers will be assigned by the WCFA. There will not be any changes to pen assignments. Does must remain in their assigned pens throughout the entire fair. All does must be doe show clipped and clean upon arrival. No body clipping will be done at the fairgrounds. No change of color of the animal by painting or dyeing will be allowed and will lead to disqualification. Each animal will be weighed one (1) time and there will be no reweighs. Weighing will be animal only (no blankets, etc.). **Any doe weighing less than 60lbs minimum is disqualified and must be removed from the fairgrounds no later than one hour after the conclusion of the goat shows.** Once the animal has qualified for the show, it cannot leave the fairgrounds.

18. **The WCFA has a zero tolerance policy on unsportsmanlike conduct: *Please see WCFA rules and regulations.***

Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated

No driving or bracing does

Unethical fitting will not be allowed

Exhibitors will not be allowed to use electronic devices on their goats. No change of color of the animal by painting or dyeing will be allowed.

The WCFA general rule relating to the prohibition on the use of drugs and other substances applies fully to the breeding doe animals. See WCFA general rules and regulations. The Breeding Doe Committee and WCFA reserve the right to perform random drug testing on all animals.

19. Exhibitors are expected to keep their pens and the area in front of their pens clean at all times. Trash should be thrown in the barrels and manure is to be put in dumpsters. No bedding is allowed in pens. The Breeding Doe Committee will be doing random checks on the welfare of the animals. The exhibitor is to feed and water their goats daily.

20. Awards will be given for the WCFA Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Does, class winners, and showmanship class winners.

21. If an exhibitor has more than one project that is eligible for sale in the livestock auction they must notify the Chairman as to which project they intend to sell no later than one hour after the final market show on Thursday, September 29, 2022. Pursuant to WCFA general rules, the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion animals must sell. If not notified of which project the exhibitor wishes to sell, the Chairman and sales committee will make the final decision as to which project will sell in the WCFA auction. There will be absolutely no writing on animals going through the auction ring. Exhibitors **ARE NOT ALLOWED** to ask for their project back or swap an animal after it has been sold in the auction. WCFA general rules will be enforced.

22. Thank-you Letters: *See the WCFA General Rules.* Thank you letters are required to be submitted to the committee chairman on Sunday, October 3rd before being cleared to leave the fairgrounds.

23. Exhibitors are responsible for the pickup and/or delivery of their sale projects during the designated time of release. Exhibitors must deliver their project to the destination designated by the buyer. Failure to comply with the pickup and delivery will result in a penalty. See general rules for amount per animal assessed by the WCFA. The WCFA assumes no responsibility for the delivery of the exhibitor's project. Every Breeding Doe exhibitor must sign an acknowledgement for proof of fair project delivery form before the release of the goat from the Breeding Doe Committee.

24. Herdsman will be judged through-out the week with a final interview Friday, September 30, 2022 at 5pm. Prizes will be awarded to the individual herdsman. A committee of judges appointed by the Breeding Doe committee will make inspections during the show, through-out the week, and during the interview to determine those exhibitors who, in their Judgement present the best herdsman skills, taking into consideration the following criteria:

1. Orderliness and cleanliness of pens and animals
2. Promptness in having pens cleaned
3. Systematic and neat arrangement of pens and service areas
4. Attention to animal through-out
5. Personal appearance of herdsman and helpers
6. Observance of all rules and regulations
7. Cooperation with show officials in prompting the fair in general
8. Interviews with the individual exhibitors regarding their entries and livestock exhibits.

25. A Peewee Breeding Doe Showmanship Class will take place after the Sale Order is complete. Peewee participants must be ages 2-8 and not a current Breeding Doe Exhibitor. Peewee participants will be paired with volunteer Junior and Senior Breeding Doe Exhibitors for the show and will be judged on showmanship by a volunteer judge. Prizes will be given to the top 2 exhibitors and all participants will get a participation award.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN AUTOMATIC DIQUALIFICATION AND DOES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO TAG-IN OR SHOW. NO EXCEPTIONS.
